INTERNATIONAL DRUG PREVENTION QUALITY STANDARDS AND DEVELOPMENT OF FAMILY SKILLS

Wadih Maalouf, PhD, Programme Coordinator for Prevention, Treatment and Rehabilitation Sector, Drug Prevention and Health Branch, UNODC

Wadih Maalouf has a PHD degree in Epidemiology and has previously worked as the UNODC Programme Coordinator Expert, and a public health professional.

NORWEGIAN ADDICTION RESEARCH AT THE FOREFRONT

Hildegunn Sagvaag, Associate Professor, Dr. PH, Faculty of Social Sciences/Department of Health Studies, University of Stavanger, Norway

Hildegunn Sagvaag will highlight three main concepts from the European research project "Addiction and Lifestyles In Contemporary Europe: Reframing Addictions Project", or ALICE RAP, and reflect on the translation of these concepts into local practice. The need of reframing addiction indicate that the term has some limitations in framing the phenomenon and as a result of that, limitation in handling problems and challenges linked to addiction. The public concern for the impact of addictions vary across countries and social traditions.

UNGASS 2016: AN OVERVIEW

Linda Nilsson, Secretary General, World Federation Against Drugs

Linda Nilsson has been active in the drug policy debate since 2009, she is since 2014 Secretary General of World Federation Against Drugs, an umbrella organization with 170 member organizations all over the world. She was the representative of the global voice of prevention on the Civil Society Task Force to ensure a meaningful participation of civil society in the lead up to UNGASS 2016.

Sue Thau, Public Policy Consultant, CADCA (Community Anti-Drug Coalitions of America) is the leading U.S. substance abuse prevention organization, representing over 5,000 community-based coalitions across the United States and in 22 countries who work to create safe, healthy, and drug-free communities.

Sue Thau is a Public Policy Consultant at CADCA. She is nationally recognized for her advocacy and legislative accomplishments on behalf of the substance abuse

prevention field. Sue has an extensive background in public policy and has held high positions at the federal, state, and local levels.

Sue Thau was a Budget Examiner and Legislative Analyst at the Office of Management and Budget, in the Executive Office of the President for over ten years.

Sue was a driving force behind the passage, reauthorization and full funding of the Drug-Free Communities Act. She is highly respected as an expert on demand reduction issues by members of Congress and staff on both sides of the aisle on Capitol Hill.

INCB: BREACHING the UN CONVENTIONS ON DRUGS

Werner Sipp, President, International Narcotics Control Board, INCB (TBC)

Werner Sipp is a lawyer, had senior administrative posts in several German Federal Ministries (1997-2008). He was a Head of the Division for Narcotic Law and International Narcotic Drugs Affairs in the Federal Ministry of Health. He is a Permanent Correspondent of Germany in the Pompidou Group of the Council of Europe (2001-2008), a member of the INCB since 2012 and First Vice President of the INCB in 2014.

WHO latest report on Cannabis is "The Health and Social effects of non-medical cannabis use".

Cannabis is globally the most commonly used psychoactive substance under international control. There is an increasing demand of treatment for cannabis use disorders and associated health conditions in high- and middle-income countries. There has been increased attention to the public health aspects of cannabis use and related disorders in international policy dialogues.
